Mission Creek Regional Park

Experience the beauty of fall colours and the quiet of winter along Mission Creek's forested trails. Watch for kokanee salmon in the spawning channel during autumn, then return in winter for peaceful walks, birdwatching, and crisp seasonal scenery. With year-round trails and the EECO Centre, it's a perfect place to connect with nature in every season.


